

When the grasshoppers gathered the next day, Gary asked, “How did it go?”


Gail stood up and said, “I went to an ant, and she wouldn’t give me and my family any food.”

The grasshoppers and ants went to war against the beetles. “Attack!” yelled Gary and Alex when they saw the beetles. But the beetles were much too strong.




The leader of the beetles said to the ants and the grasshoppers, “We don’t want to be your rulers. You were once a very rich nation, but now you are poor. We want to help you.
